Origin announcement 17 February

Munmorah, 17 February 2022: Generator Property Management Pty Ltd empathises with the employees, families and those associated with the announcement made by Origin Energy on the 17th of February 2022.

GPM is aware of this announcement's impact and what this means for the local economy.

At this point, GPM is investigating future uses of its Munmorah site. It is well known that GPM has immediate access to available land and network access that can be used for infrastructure to support the electricity network's continued reliable operation.

GPM Managing Director Stephen Saladine said, "We have been in preliminary discussions with industry participants to explore opportunities that the Munmorah site can play in maintaining the reliability and low-cost operation of the NSW Electricity Network. This will present investment opportunities that will support the local and wider community's electricity requirements and provide new jobs."

GPM owns the former Munmorah Power Station site on the NSW Central Coast. GPM was responsible for the safe demolition of that power station and now continues to manage the accountable remediation of the site. This site involves approximately 700 hectares of surrounding land and infrastructure, including an Ash Dam. GPM also owns the areas of the Wallerawang Power Station in the Central Tablelands of NSW; the site is north of the Castlereagh Highway, comprising an area of approximately 528 ha.

GPM's key focus at Wallerawang has been planning for the safe closure of the Kerosene Vale Ash Repository and the Sawyers Swamp Creek Ash Dam and then appropriately remediating the balance of the site for permanent closure.

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
